TITLE: Resolution Authorizing the Submittal of Grant Applications to the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization Complete Streets and other Local Initiatives Program Grant - **(Commission Districts 1 and 2)**

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing the submittal of grant applications to the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Complete Streets and other Local Initiatives Program (CSLIP) for NE 26th Street Complete Streets Project and NE 15th Avenue Complete Streets Project.

Background

Annually, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) puts out a call for projects for the MPO Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP). CSLIP is a competitive grant program aimed to fund medium sized projects with construction costs between \$500,000 and \$3,000,000 including Complete Streets, Safety & Security, Sustainability Initiatives, and Technology Advancements. Each municipality may submit up to two (2) city projects, and up to two (2) projects in partnership with other agencies or cities. The application requires a resolution of support from the City Commission.

Applications will be objectively evaluated based on connectivity, mobility, safety, and economic development with bonus points applied to projects identified in the MPO adopted plans. Projects will be ranked with top projects receiving funding based on the availability of funds. Awarded projects will be vetted by the Local Agency Program (LAP), which regulates how Federal Funds are spent on local roadways by municipalities. The City will be required to manage the design and construction of the project as well as fund the Contingency costs. The grant is reimbursable beginning with design in FY2029 and the Construction funded in FY2032.

Several years ago, the MPO changed the available funding for this competitive grant program. Previously the program funded approximately 14 projects annually, and currently the project funds 3-4 projects depending on the cost of the projects. City staff continues to submit these priority projects to the program as they continue to score well in the quantitative scoring system.

The City Commission has provided support to submit these two grant proposals to the CSLIP Grant program previously on November 17, 2020 and October 21, 2021.

The proposed projects include:

- **NE 15th Avenue Complete Streets Project**
(Districts 1 & 2 – Lake Ridge & Poinsettia Heights) - The project is located on NE 15th Avenue between Sunrise Blvd and the South Fork of the Middle River. The project will create a consistent cross-section for the length of the project and improve pedestrian crossings. Mentioned project is a priority for the Lake Ridge Neighborhood Mobility Master Plan (completed in 2015), as it provides traffic calming through the installation of a median, bike lanes, crosswalks, addressing conflicts at the southern end of the project, raised intersections at NE 12th Street and NE 11th Street, and reducing the number of lanes to match the cross-section to the north of NE 13th Street. Proposed project will improve the section between NE 13th Street and the South Fork of the Middle River by adding a pedestrian crossing at NE 14th Street to improve safety for school children, raised intersections, raised crosswalks, extension of several medians, resurface the roadway, and deliver enhancements on the corridor, as identified by the Poinsettia Heights neighborhood.
- **NE 26th Street Complete Streets Project**
(District 1 – Coral Ridge Association) - Proposed project is located on NE 26th Street from US1 to Bayview Drive and will implement the neighborhood's Master Plan. The proposed improvements include a sidewalk on the north side of the street, updated traffic calming features through raised intersections and tightening of turning radii, bike lanes, an extended left turn lane from NE 26th westbound onto US1, and a roundabout at the intersection of NE 26th Street and Bayview Dr., intersection improvements at NE 26th Street and Middle River Drive, and the upgrade of roadway lighting to improve safety and sustainability.

Staff met with the Poinsettia Heights Board, Lake Ridge Residents Association, and Coral Ridge Association many times over the past several years regarding these projects and have verified support of the projects and to finalize the details of the project scopes.

Resource Impact

If awarded, the funding will be through a reimbursable grant beginning in FY2029. The City will be required to provide contingency funding for the awarded project in FY2032. The cost estimates are below for each project:
