TITLE: Motion Accepting a Donation of a Multi Casualty Incident (MCI) bags, Rapid

Response Kit, and Sensory kits for Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue from the Broward County Health Care Coalition via Davie Fire Rescue for \$7,965.68

## **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the City Manager to accept a donation of Multi Casualty Incident (MCI) bags, a Rapid Response Kit, and Sensory kits for Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue and to execute any documents required to accept the equipment between Broward County Health Care Coalition via Davie Fire Rescue and the City of Fort Lauderdale.

## **Background**

The Broward County Health Care Coalition (BCHC) has funded a grant via Davie Fire Rescue to support emergency preparedness, response, and recovery activities. Davie Fire Rescue wrote the grant for all fire rescue agencies within Broward County. The risk score from a jurisdictional risk assessment completed by the Broward County Health Care Coalition listed "Human Cause" hazards: Active Shooter/Hostile Event/MCI as a 67% risk. The project improves internal response by increasing availability of supplies on hand to treat life-threatening conditions. Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue will receive three (3) multicasualty incident (MCI) kits and one (1) rapid response kit to be prepared for an Active Shooter/Hostile event.

- Three (3) Multi-Casualty Incident (MCI) Kits @ \$1,625.79/ea. = \$4,877.37
- One (1) Rapid Response Kit @ \$1,363.31/ea.

Additionally, Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue will receive 23 sensory/comfort kits. The sensory/comfort kits are designed to aid fire rescue personnel with the tools to provide comfort and improve communication with patients with autism and different anxiety disorders.

Twenty-three (23) sensory/comfort kits @ \$75/ea. = \$1,725

## **Resource Impact**

This action will result in a positive impact to the City. The value of the donated equipment – MCI bags, rapid response kit and sensory/comfort kits is \$7,965.68
