

 - Neighbor Support Division




- Both programs approved by City Commission in Fiscal Year 2022
- Partially funded for Fiscal Year 2023

Transportation Circulator Services Overview


- Vendor: Circuit Transit
- Six-Month Pilot Period
 - Ends in February 2023
- Six Downtown Vehicles
 - General Fund: \$260,000
- Two Barrier Island Vehicles
 - Parking Fund: \$90,000

- Identify Funding to finish FY2023
- Plan for FY2024 General Fund Contribution at \$600,000
- Explore Brightline Partnership

Pilot #1: Barrier Island

- Parking Fund Service
- Sell / Reallocate Existing

- Identify Funding to finish FY2023
- Plan for FY2024 Parking Fund Contribution at \$225,000
- Increase Service during Special Events

Housing Navigation Program Overview

- Goal: To provide field outreach, complete intake assessments, and connect people who are homeless with appropriate services for housing.
- Unique partnership between Fort Lauderdale Police Department Homeless Outreach Team, Neighbor Support Division, and TaskForce Fore Ending Homelessness







Pilot Program Importance

- Addressing a City Commission Top Priority: Homelessness and Housing Opportunities
- Collaborating with TaskForce staff who have the experience and essential resources needed to build relationships and provide support
- Extensive knowledge in developing housing strategies and expediting processes (including case management)

Pilot Program Success

• In three months, we have linked 60% (12) of our identified cohort to services













Potential Next Steps

- Continue with the Housing Navigation Program, approximately a \$160,000 annual cost
- Promote landlord recruitment: Broward County Project Home Again
- Launch educational outreach sessions for neighborhoods with TaskForce
- Collaborate with TaskForce to address encampment areas and long-term housing solutions
