**TITLE:** Public Hearing - Resolution Approving a Waiver of Limitations at 2150 SW  
23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, for the Installation of Two (2) Mooring Piles Extending a  
Maximum of 45' +/- – **(Commission District 4)**

---

**Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a Resolution approving a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of two (2) mooring piles extending a maximum of 45' +/- into the adjacent South Fork of the New River located at 2150 SW 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue.

**Background**

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow piles to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 D of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of two (2) mooring piles extending a maximum of 45' +/- from the property line into the New River.

The applicant's Summary Description specifies that the proposed structures are necessary for safely mooring owner's boat due to significant wake resulting from multiple marinas and boat yards within close proximity.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$1500 is required.

The Marine Advisory Board recommended approval of the application 10 to 0 (see Exhibit 3) at the October 6, 2022 MAB meeting.

**Resource Impact**

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$1,500. Revenue related to the application fee is included in the FY2023 Operating Budget in the account listed below.
