- TITLE: First Reading Ordinance Amending the City of Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinances Chapter Nine, Building and Construction, Article Two Permits and Inspections, Division Two Fees to Adjust Building Fees for Services Related to Land Development and Permitting- (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

# **Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission consider an ordinance amending the City of Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinance, Chapter Nine Building and Construction, Article Two Permits and Inspections, Division Two Fees to adjust building fees for services related to land development and permitting.

#### **Background**

In September 2022, the City Commission approved an ordinance amending and increasing building fees for master permits from 1.25 percent of a project's total estimated construction costs to 1.5 percent. This increase was approved to offset the Division's operational expenses related to permitting and enforcement of the Florida Building Code and to remain financially sound by recovering the full cost of services provided. However, this ordinance amendment did not include the increase in fees for Permits by Affidavit.

According to Florida Statutes § 553.791, Permits by Affidavit allow applicants to hire thirdparty providers to conduct inspections and plan reviews for their permits as opposed to paying the administrative costs to the City of Fort Lauderdale for conducting the plan reviews and inspections. The use of a third-party provider decreases the direct costs for the City to carry out its duties in accordance with the Florida Building Code on behalf of the City by 18% if a private provider is conducting the inspections or 36% if a private provider is conducting the inspections and plan reviews.

To ensure the discounted rate given to Permits by Affidavit remains consistent despite changes to the master permit fee, the fee schedule ordinance for Permits by Affidavit will be amended so Permit by Affidavit applicants will be charged the standard master permit fee and then will receive applicable fee reductions by the type of Permits by Affidavit. With this change, an 18% fee reduction in the master permit fee will be applied for Permits by

Affidavit with inspections only while Permits by Affidavit with inspections and plan reviews will be given a 36% reduction.

# Resource Impact
