








Las Olas Isles Crosswalks










Dual Left Turn – Las Olas @ SE 15th Avenue

HENDRICKS ISLE SEAWALL REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The City of Fort Lauderdale is working with Ebsary Foundation Co. to replace 320 linear feet of City-owned seawalls along the northern end of Hendricks Isle. This project includes:

- · constructing two new seawalls with new sheet pile and a
- new concrete cap

 installing new stormwater infrastructure
- restoring pavement and landscaping

The improvements made as part of this project will help reduce tidal flooding along Hendricks Isle and make us better prepared for future king tide events and sea level rise.

Construction activities are starting on Monday, August 15 when crews will be mobilizing equipment and materials and removing the trees along the westernmost seawall. Work on this seawall is expected to be completed by the end of October 2022. Overall completion of the project is expected



Intermittent lane closures are expected along Hendricks Isle Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please follow posted signs and drive with caution in the area.

Vibration Monitoring

During the seawall construction process, vibration monitoring will be provided by the contractor and the City's inspector to prevent damage to adjacent properties. Monitoring equipment may need to be installed on private property (with
