Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the settlement of the workers' compensation claims in the matter of Hamoud Alsamawi v. City of Fort Lauderdale, Case No. 20-020841MJR, 20-020846MJR, and 20-020849MJR in the amount of \$155,000.

Background

Hamoud Alsamawi, a Police Officer with the Police Department, filed four workers' compensation claims for injuries that occurred on August 5, 2018, February 9, 2019, February 26, 2020, and December 27, 2020, while in the course and scope of employment with the City, which were accepted as compensable under Chapter 440, Florida Statutes. Officer Alsamawi filed litigation against the City on September 14, 2020, for his August 5, 2018, February 9, 2019, and February 26, 2020 injuries.

Staff and defense counsel's evaluation of the potential financial exposure to the City determined that a settlement would provide the most cost-effective outcome. Through negotiations, a settlement was reached in the amount of \$155,000, subject to the approval of the City Commission.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$155,000.
