TITLE:	Second Reading - Ordinance Amending Section 8-91 Mooring Structures - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt on second reading an amendment to the City of Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinances reflecting a definition change in Section 8-91 (a) (2) *Mooring Structures* to ensure consistency with definitions in the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR), Sections 47-19.3 (a) (1) and (2) *Boat slips, docks, boat davits, hoists and similar mooring structures.*

Background

On March 23, 2023 (CAM 23-0168), the City of Fort Lauderdale Commission adopted amendments to ULDR Section 47-19.3 *Boat slips, docks, boat davits, hoists and similar mooring structures* including modification of the definitions of mooring device and mooring structure. To ensure consistency of definitions across the code, Section 8-91 (a)(2) *Mooring Structures* also needs to be modified. The Commission approved these amendments on first reading on April 18, 2023 (CAM 23-0342).

The ordinance (Exhibit 1) being proposed includes the following key modifications:

- (1) Mooring devices means a subset of <u>are devices attached to</u> mooring structures as defined herein, including boat davits, hoists, boat lifts and similar <u>items</u>. devices that are erected on or adjacent to a seawall or dock and upon which a vessel can be moored. A mooring device does not include docks, slips, seawall or mooring pile.
- (2) Mooring structure means a dock, <u>marginal dock</u>, <u>slip</u>, seawall, boat davit, hoist, boat lift, mooring pile, finger pier, or a similar structure attached to land more or less permanently to which a vessel can be moored.

Resource Impact
