Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) - (Commission District 3)

#### Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission hold a public hearing and amend the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan for Community Development Block Grant to reprogram CDBG public services funds in the amount of \$21,344 forfeited by the Delta Education and Life Development Foundation, Inc ("DELTA") and award those funds to Habitat for Humanity Broward ("Habitat") to conduct first-time homebuyers education and training classes.

#### Background

On June 15, 2021 the City Commission approved CDBG Public Service funding for DELTA in the amount of \$21,344. The City entered into a participation agreement with DELTA dated October 1, 2021 to operate a Youth Mentorship Program to mentor youths from low-income households. DELTA faced challenges with program enrollment and income documentation due in part to the COVID-19 pandemic. As such, DELTA communicated to the City that it is in DELTA's best interest to forfeit the FY 2021-2022 CDBG funding and re-apply at a later date.

The Community Service Board (CSB), at its meeting held on October 10, 2022, recommended City reprogram and award the funds to Habitat to conduct first-time homeowner education and training.

Habitat's Homeowner Services provides education, counseling, and support to Low and Moderate Income (LMI) applicants to successfully navigate the road to first-time homeownership. Services offered result in a comprehensive positive outcome to participating families and our community. To do this, the Homeowner Services program conducts community outreach, homebuyer qualification and selection, homeowner/youth education, financial and life skill counseling, and closing and post-closing support. These elements collectively create a platform for the successful transition of families eager for the opportunity to own their own home. Perhaps, most importantly, the program removes barriers LMI families face in understanding and navigating the home-buying process, obtaining an affordable home mortgage, and achieving the economic empowerment successful,

12/06/2022 CAM #22-1069 permanent homeownership delivers.

The program will serve up to twenty four (24) eligible low-income, first-time homebuyers in Fort Lauderdale.

# FIRST AMENDMENT TO CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PUBLIC SERVICE PROGRAM PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT (FY 2022-2023)

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT, with an effective date of October 1, 2023, is entered into by and between the City of Fort Lauderdale, a Florida municipal corporation with its principal address at 100 N. Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301 (hereinafter "City"), and Habitat for Humanity of Broward, Inc., a Florida non-profit organization with its principal address at 888 N.W. 62<sup>ND</sup> STREET 2<sup>ND</sup> Floor, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33309 (hereinafter "Participant").

WHEREAS, the City receives Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to undertake particular activities, including the provision of public services to eligible persons under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Public Law 93-383, as amended ("HCD Act"); and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2022, City and Participant entered into a Public Service Program Participation Agreement in accordance with the Annual Action Plan approved by the City Commission on **December 6, 2022, CAM #22-1069**, for a total funding amount of Twenty-One Thousand Three Hundred Forty-Four Dollars and Zero Cents (\$21,344.00) to administer the City's **Program** ("Participation Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Section II of the Participation Agreement provides in part that Participant will forfeit all funds not expended during the contract's term unless such failure is based on circumstances beyond Participant's control and an extension for Participant to perform the contracted Services is approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is requesting a one-time extension to the Participant Agreement for an additional twelve (12) months, commencing October 1, 2023, and ending on September 30, 2024, because Participant has not expended the funds allocated under this Participation Agreement due to circumstances beyond Participant's control; and

WHEREAS, the City finds Participant's failure to expend the funds City allocated under the Participation Agreement was beyond Participant's control and wish to grant the Participant a one-time extension of the original term of the Participation Agreement for a period not to exceed twelve (12) months, commencing October 1, 2023, and ending on September 30,2024 so Participant may expend the balance of the allocated funds, subject to all other terms and conditions of the Participation Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter contained and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

I. <u>RECITALS:</u> The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

II. <u>AMENDMENTS:</u> Section II of the Participation Agreement titled "Term and Time of Performance" is amended as follows:


The contract term shall be extended for a period not to exceed twelve (12) months, which shall commence on October 1, 2023, and shall end on September 30, 2024, so Participant may expend the balance of the allocated funds, subject to all other terms and conditions of the Participation Agreement. This is a one-time extension and City shall not be obligated to provide additional term extensions to the Participant. Any unexpended funds after September 30, 2024, shall be forfeited by Participant and may be reprogrammed by the City for other eligible CDBG use or programs.

- III. <u>HEADINGS:</u> Headings herein are for the convenience of reference only and shall not be considered on any interpretation of this First Amendment or the Participation Agreement.
- IV. <u>NO OTHER CHANGES</u>: Except as modified by this First Amendment to the Participation Agreement, all terms, covenants, obligations and provisions of the Participation Agreement, shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect, and are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed by the parties in every respect. If the terms and conditions set forth in this First Amendment directly conflict with any provision contained in the Participation Agreement, then this First Amendment to the Participation Agreement shall control.
