

RESOLUTION NO. 24-66

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING A SMALL-SCALE DERELICT VESSEL REMOVAL PROJECT AGREEMENT WITH THE FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT (FIND) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,644.00 AND DELEGATING TO THE CITY MANAGER THE AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE ANY DOCUMENTS OR INSTRUMENTS NECESSARY OR INCIDENTAL TO THE IMPLEMENTATION, ADMINISTRATION AND COMPLETION OF THE SMALL-SCALE DERELICT VESSEL REMOVAL PROJECT AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS the Florida Inland Navigation District ("FIND") can provide financial assistance for the Project Agreement between the City of Fort Lauderdale and the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) providing funding from FIND in the amount of up to \$5644.00, but in no event more than 75% of the City's out of pocket costs ("Project Amount") for the removal of An abandoned derelict 36' vessel "It is What it Is" from the Cooley's Landing Marina (hereinafter "Project"); and

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2023, the City of Fort Lauderdale Marine Police Unit deemed a 36' vessel "It is What it Is" as an abandoned derelict vessel. On October 19, 2023, Sea Tow Fort Lauderdale removed the vessel and properly disposed of it at a total cost to the City of \$7,525.00; and

WHEREAS, FIND financial assistance is required for the project referenced above. The FIND Small Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Program will fund up to 75%, or in this case \$5,644.00 of the costs used to salvage and properly dispose of this abandoned vessel. The remaining amount of \$1,881.00 from the removal of the vessel will be funded by the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:


SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby delegated the authority to execute on behalf of the City of Fort Lauderdale the Small-Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Project Agreement in an amount not to exceed \$5,644.00.

SECTION 2. That the City Manager is further delegated the authority to execute on behalf of the City any other documents or instruments necessary or incidental to the implementation, administration, and completion of the Small-Scale Vessel Removal Project Agreement.

SECTION 3. That the office of the City Attorney shall review and approve as to form all documents prior to their execution by City Officials.


SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon and after its passage.
