## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion allowing the proper City officials to enter into Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) with the TaskForce Fore Ending Homelessness (TaskForce), the Salvation Army and the United Way of Broward, Inc. (United Way) and a Partnership Agreement with Broward Partnership for Ending Homelessness, Inc. (BPHI), all in substantially the form attached, to support the City's Chronic Homeless Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project; effective January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

## Background

On December 17, 2013, the City Commission approved accepting and entering into a grant agreement with Broward County in the amount of \$440,117 and the execution of any documents associated with such funds, for the CHHC Project.
