Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing the proper City officials to execute an Interlocal Agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of Fort Lauderdale (HACFL), in substantially the form attached, to support the City's Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project; effective January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

Background

On December 17, 2013, the City Commission approved accepting and entering into a grant agreement with Broward County in the amount of \$440,117 and the execution of any documents associated with such funds, for the CHHC Project.
