### **RESOLUTION NO. 13-231**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH BROWARD COUNTY FOR THE FORT LAUDERDALE CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS HOUSING COLLABORATIVE (CHHC) PROJECT; AMENDING THE FY2014 OPERATING BUDGET AY APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$440,117; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale's application to participate in the 2012 Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care Competition which is a collaborative partnership known as the Fort Lauderdale Chronic Homelessness (CHHC) project designed to provide permanent supportive housing for the chronically homeless was approved by HUD; and

WHEREAS, the City was notified that the full requested amount of \$455,000 was funded for the City's project less the County's administrative costs of \$14,883 for a total of \$440,117;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The proper City officials are hereby authorized to execute an agreement between the City of Fort Lauderdale and Broward County for the Fort Lauderdale Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project to provide permanent supportive housing for chronically homeless individuals and families identified as the most vulnerable.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2012, and ending September 30, 2013, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in Commission Agenda Memo #13-1592, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> That the office of the City Attorney shall review and approve as to form all documents prior to their execution by City officials.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution:

- 1. Authorizing the proper City officials to accept and enter into a grant agreement with Broward County in the amount of \$440,117, and to execute any documents associated with acceptance of such funds, for the Fort Lauderdale Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative Project to provide permanent supportive housing for the most vulnerable chronically homeless; and
- 2. Amending the FY 2014 operation budget by appropriating grant funding in the amount of \$440,117.

## **Background**

On August 28, 2012, the City of Fort Lauderdale was accepted to become Broward County's partner in a 2012 Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care Competition. The City submitted an application for a project designed to provide permanent supportive housing for the chronically homeless.

On August 1, 2013, the City was notified that HUD released the final awards from the 2012 Competition, and that the City's project was funded for \$455,000, the full amount requested.

The project is a collaborative partnership known as the Fort Lauderdale Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project to develop a program that provides the chronically homeless with permanent supportive hosing.

The grant award totaling \$440,117 is divided into three separate units as follows:

Supportive Services: \$84,630

Operations: 92,300

Leasing: 248,304

Administration: 14,883

Total: \$ 440.117

(Note: The total amount is after Broward County subtracted their administrative costs in the amount of \$14,883 from the total \$455,000 HUD award.)

The City's partners, including Broward Partnership for Homeless, Inc. (BPHI); Housing Authority of the City of Fort Lauderdale (HACFL); Salvation Army of Broward County; United Way of Broward County; and the Task Force Fore Ending Homelessness, Inc.; on the CHHC Project will be providing cash matches and in-kind services.

HACFL will supply housing units; BPHI will provide support services; the United Way of Broward County will provide a \$30,000 cash match; the Taskforce Fore Ending Homelessness will assist in locating the most vulnerable; and the Salvation Army will assist with temporary shelter. The City has hired a Homeless Project Grant Coordinator to coordinate the administrative requirements of the grant.

Additionally, cash match and in-kind services will be provided as follows:

Cash: \$ 40,664 BPHI

\$ 40,000 City of Fort Lauderdale

In-kind: \$ 10,000 Fort Lauderdale Police Department

\$ 7,500 Fort Lauderdale Fire Department

An additional \$ 50,992 in Fort Lauderdale Emergency Solution Funds (ESG) Funds will be allocated toward the grant.

This is a reimbursable HUD grant that will be administered by Broward County. The City intends to enter into an Agreement, in substantially the form attached as Exhibit 1, with Broward County to provide the services.

The City also intends to enter into sub-agreements with its CHHC Project partners, BPHI, HACFL, Salvation Army of Broward County, United Way of Broward County, and the Task Force Fore Ending Homelessness, Inc. Staff will bring these agreements before the City Commission on January 7, 2014.

The City's partners on this CHHC Project are either non-profits or a governmental agency and pursuant to the City Code of Ordinances Section 2-189(c) may be exempt from the City's competitive process.

Upon execution of the Agreement with Broward County, it is anticipated the project will commence on January 1, 2014. In accordance with the terms of the Agreement, the City will provide permanent supportive housing for chronically homeless individuals and families identified as the most vulnerable. The most vulnerable will be identified by administering the 100,000 Homes Vulnerability Index, which will be administered in conjunction with Broward County's annual Point in Time Count scheduled for January 21-23,2014.

## Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact to the City. Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund and Grants Fund in the amount of \$483,177 to facilitate the Fort Lauderdale Chronic Homelessness Housing Collaborative (CHHC) Project as indicated in the funding detail below.
