Whether you have an apartment balcony or acres of property, you can create a garden that attracts beautiful wildlife and helps restore habitat in commercial and residential areas.

By providing food, water, cover and a place for wildlife to raise their young, you not only help wildlife, but you also qualify to become an official Certified Wildlife Habitat® and join more than 150,000 sites across the country.

You need:

- 3 food sources
- 1 water source
- 3 cover and nesting sources
- \$20 registration
- \$30 optional aluminum sign

Once certified, you receive a 1-year subscription to the award-winning National Wildlife Magazine.




