TITLE: Motion to approve Task Order No. 4 in the amount of \$21,610 with The Corradino Group, Inc., for Florida Department of Transportation SR A1A (SE 17th Street Causeway) Beautification Project - P11896

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order No. 4 with The Corradino Group, Inc., in the amount of \$21,610 for construction engineering inspection services.

Background

This project is located on SR A1A (SE 17TH Street Causeway) from US-1 to Mayan Drive. The construction work includes clearing and grubbing, grading, installation of landscaping in the median and along the roadway, adjusting sprinkler heads if necessary, installing new sod, and landscaping all appurtenant work in the median and under the bridge.

At the November 6, 2012 Regular meeting (CAM 12-2299, RFQ 626-10881, PUR-3), the City Commission approved an agreement for civil engineering consultant services with The Corradino Group, Inc., among others. Staff has negotiated Task Order No. 4, with The Corradino Group, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$ 21,610. Note that the master contract does not have a dollar value, thus requiring City Commission approval for these services.

This project is jointly funded using a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) between the City and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$21,610 for this task order.
