TITLE: Motion to approve additional expenditures for undercover vehicle rental services – contract 13-C-103 - \$14,760 (two year cost \$29,520)

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve additional expenditures for undercover vehicle rental services through the Southeast Florida Governmental Purchasing Cooperative (Co-Op) contract 13-C-103, to 2<sup>nd</sup> Chance Holdings, Inc., d/b/a Budget Car Rental in the annual amount of \$14,760 (two year cost \$29,520) and authorize the City Manager to approve the additional expenditures for two, two-year renewal options, contingent upon appropriation of funds.

## **Background**

On August 20, 2013, the City Commission approved a two-year contract (Commission Agenda Memo 13-1022) for undercover vehicle rental services. It has become necessary for the Police Department to rent two additional vehicles.

The Police Department's use of undercover vehicles in 2013 played a significant role in solving crimes and apprehending criminals. To continue that success, the Police Department will use federal confiscation funds to rent two additional undercover vehicles.

## Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$6,150 for vehicle rental services in Fiscal Year 2014. Future expenditures are contingent upon approval and appropriation of the annual budget.
