TITLE: Consolidated Budget Amendment

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2015 Budget.

Background

Budget amendments are consolidated into one agenda item for consideration at the first meeting of each month.

Examples of recommended actions within the consolidated budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds:
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- transfer between capital projects;
- acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget and Community Investment Plan by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

Parks and Recreation

A. Transfer between capital projects – Park Impact Fee Fund – Parks and Recreation System Master Plan - \$300,000

The Parks and Recreation System Master Plan is a critical component of the City's Parks and Recreation accreditation. This 10-year master plan will complement the existing Long Range Strategic Plan and integrate the City's Vision and Strategic Plans. The estimated cost of the master plan is \$300,000. Funds will be transferred from another planned project that is expected to cost less than is currently budgeted.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Parks Impact Fee Fund in the amount of \$300,000 for a comprehensive 10-year Parks and Recreation System Master Plan.

Police

B. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Program Grant - \$47,000

The City of Fort Lauderdale was awarded grant funding in the amount of \$47,000 from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Program. The program combats the use and distribution of synthetic drugs within the City. Funding will be used to supplement staffing and rental of a vehicle to support activities related to the program. This grant does not require a cash match. The grant agreement will be presented at the December 17, 2014 Regular City Commission Meeting (CAM 14-1495).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$47,000 for the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Program.

C. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – Homeland Security Grant - \$4,070

The City of Fort Lauderdale was awarded grant funding in the amount of \$4,070 from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the Port Security Program. The program protects the City's waterways from suspicious vessels and enhances the Marine's unit response as members of the Regional Domestic Security Task Force. Funding will be used to purchase radiation detectors, which are used on daily patrols and for special events. This grant does not require a cash match. The grant agreement will be presented at the December 17, 2014 Regular City Commission meeting (CAM 14-1501).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$4,070 for the

Port Security Program.

D. Appropriation from fund balance – Law Enforcement Confiscated Property Funds – donation for Crime Stoppers Program and other contributions - \$30,000

Annually, the City provides a donation to the Broward County Crime Stoppers Program utilizing Law Enforcement Confiscated Property Funds. For FY 2015, the City will contribute \$10,000. The organization collects anonymous crime information throughout Broward County and then relays the information to the appropriate law enforcement agency. If the information is valid and useful, Crime Stoppers will provide the monetary reward. This service has been beneficial to the City and has yielded many arrests that led to closing of cases and the recovery of narcotics, cash, and property. The donation request is a companion item on this agenda (CAM 14-1476).

In addition, donations totaling \$20,000 will be provided to agencies that support juvenile crime and violence prevention, support positive alternatives to drugs and violence, or that build trust and opens lines of communication between Police Officers and the community.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Law Enforcement Confiscated Property Funds in the amount of \$30,000 for the Broward County Crime Stoppers Program.

Public Works

E. Appropriation from fund balance – Water and Sewer Fund – upgrade software module for Cayenta Utilities Billing System- \$157,640

An upgrade to the City's Cayenta Utilities Billing System is recommended. The current system does not allow remote updates to accounts, does not interface with the newly installed Customer Relationship Management (CRM) system, and has significantly increased in cost over the years. An upgraded module will incorporate these functions. The current system costs the City \$125,000 for annual maintenance. The new system will cost \$282,640 for the first year for implementation and training. Subsequent years will cost \$25,000 in annual maintenance. The purchase agreement will be presented at the December 17, 2014 Regular City Commission Meeting (CAM 14-1466).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Water and Sewer Fund in the amount of \$157,640 for the purchase of a software module for the Cayenta Utilities Billing system.

F. Transfer between capital projects – Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund – Pump Station D-37 Rehabilitation - \$988,282

The City of Fort Lauderdale is in the process of awarding the contract for the Pump Station D-37 Rehabilitation Project. The project replaces the current pump with a triplex submersible pump and includes the installation of valves, pipes, fittings, pumps, electrical controls, new wetwell and valve vault structures; soil remediation; demolition of mechanical, electrical, and ventilation equipment within an existing pump house; purchase of new emergency generator; architectural modifications; door and window improvements to the pump house; and landscape and irrigation. This project is critical to the City's sanitary sewer infrastructure. The estimated cost of the project is \$3,256,087 with \$2,267,805 in funds currently available. The remaining \$988,282 in funding requirements is recommended to come from a completed project. The contract award will be presented at the Regular City Commission Meeting on December 17, 2014 (CAM 14-1454).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$988,282 for the Pump Station D-37 Rehabilitation Project.

G. Transfer between capital and operating budgets – Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund and Water and Sewer Fund - Annual Sewer Repair Contract - \$614,720

Annually, the City provides an approved budget for the purposes of sewer repair. For FY 2015, the cost estimates for the citywide gravity sewer mains repair were in excess of the approved budget by \$614,720. The recommended funding source is a completed project.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund and the Water and Sewer Fund in the amount of \$614,720 for the installation and restoration of various gravity sewer systems.

H. Appropriation from fund balance and transfer between capital projects - General Capital Projects Fund – Palm Aire Wall Improvements project - \$357,926.72

The Palm Aire Homeowner's Association approved a project to install a six foot Podocarpus Hedge and polyvinyl chloride (PVC) wall along Northwest 31st Avenue and Northwest 62nd Street for a total of \$432,000. Staff recommends funding from three completed or under budget projects for a total of \$102,891.72 and an additional \$255,035 from the General Capital Projects Fund. The remaining balance of the project cost will be requested through the Community Block Grant Funds process in future years.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Community Investment Plan and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$357,926.72 for the completion of the Palm Aire Wall Project.

I. Transfer between capital projects - Stormwater Fund - additional funding for stormwater improvements - \$541,600

At the November 4, 2014 Regular City Commission Meeting, a grant from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (CAM 14-1326) was accepted for the purposes of stormwater improvements in the Southeast Isles Neighborhood. There is no cash match required; however, additional funding is needed to further enhance the stormwater infrastructure to improve the drainage system in the amount of \$541,600. Staff recommends the Southeast Isles Tidal and Stormwater Improvements Project as a funding source.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Stormwater Fund in the amount of \$541,600 for the stormwater improvements to the Southeast Isles Neighborhood.

Transportation and Mobility

J. Appropriation from fund balance - General Fund - Wave Streetcar - \$2,500,000

In order to comply with the Wave Streetcar Agreement with the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), transference of the required \$2.5 million is due prior to December 31, 2014. This transfer will count towards the City's \$10.5 million contribution to the project. After this payment, the balance will be \$4.8 million and is expected to be made through a land swap, no later than April 30, 2015.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund in the amount of \$2.5 million for the annual contribution to the Wave Streetcar.

K. Appropriation from fund balance – Airport Fund - Purchase of pick-up trucks – \$53.236

To assist with daily operational tasks, such as debris and trash collection, transport of emergency and maintenance equipment, and patrol of the Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport properties, two pick-up trucks will be purchased. The estimated cost of the two pick-up trucks is \$53,236. The purchase request is a companion item on this agenda (CAM 14-1460).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Airport Fund in the amount of \$53,236 for the purchase of the two pick-up trucks.

L. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – Sun Trolley Beach Link Route –\$165,560

The City of Fort Lauderdale was awarded \$165,560 from the Florida Department of Transportation to continue funding operating costs of the Sun Trolley Beach Link Route. Operating costs include Tuesday through Thursday service days on the route. This daily route provides reliable transportation service for tourists, hotel business guests, convention attendees, workers, and residents in this highly congested yet vital economic area. The joint participation agreement is a companion item on this agenda (CAM 14-1405).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$165,560 to continue the Sun Trolley Beach Link Route service Tuesday through Thursdays.

M. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – transit corridor grants - \$364,453

The City of Fort Lauderdale was awarded two grants in the amount of \$364,453 from the Florida Department of Transportation to continue expansion operations of Sun Trolley services. Funds will be used for operating costs of the Uptown Link (\$181,773) and operating costs for one of the two buses operating on the Downtown Link (\$182,680). Continued services to the area are expected to increase capacity, reduce headways, and build ridership. The route has also been extended to the north and south to serve additional neighborhoods, connect to Broward Medical Center, and more closely align with the Wave route. There is no cash match requirement. The grant acceptances are companion items on this agenda (CAM 14-1403 and 14-1404).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2015 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$364,453 for the continued operations for Sun Trolley services.
