TITLE:	Workshop – Citywide Development Trends

Background

On October 7, 2014 the City Commission requested to host a workshop to discuss development patterns throughout the City of Fort Lauderdale. The objective of the workshop is for the City Commission to analyze development trends and the existing regulations that guide development, to provide input on guiding future growth within the City.

To assist the City Commission in the discussion, staff prepared a background paper, attached as Exhibit 1, which includes an overview of factors contributing to the City's existing development patterns and built environment, including documents that guide future growth, as well as an overview of best practices and other related information.

The paper includes a map indicating more significant development project trends over the past five years, a map portraying city-wide zoning patterns and maximum height regulations, and a map of existing flex zones depicting the available number of residential flex units in each zone.
