TITLE: South Middle River Neighborhood Improvement Project – \$799,067.72

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the award of the South Middle River Neighborhood Improvement Project to the lowest cost, responsive, and responsible bidder Stanford & Sons Trucking Corporation, d/b/a Stanford Construction Company (Stanford Co.), in the amount of \$799,067.72.

Background

The South Middle River Neighborhood improvement project is for the removal of existing excess pavement and impervious area as well as the construction of one-way roadways along Northwest 15th Street in the South Middle River Neighborhood.

On January 15, 2015, Invitation to Bid No. 253-11535 opened for this project and eight responses were received. It was determined that Stanford Co. is the lowest cost, responsive, and responsible bidder in the amount of \$799,067.72.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$799,067.72 for the contract, \$79,907.28 for estimated in-house engineering fees, for a total impact of \$ \$878,975. The available balances in the chart below reflects the amounts remaining after the removal of pre-encumbrances established for this purchase.
