TITLE:	QUASI-JUDICIAL - Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 505 Idlewyld Drive for the Relocation of a Boatlift

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the relocation of a boatlift at 505 Idlewyld Drive.

Background

At the June 3, 2014 City Commission meeting, the applicant was granted a Waiver of Limitations of Section 47-19.3 (C) and (D) (a waiver to allow a dock, mooring structure, or boat lift to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of a concrete floating dock with access walkway/ramp, boatlift, and two mooring pilings extending a maximum of 68.5 feet from the property line into the New River Sound. Subsequently, the Broward County Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department and the United States Army Corps of Engineers have requested that the boat lift be relocated from the approved 27 feet 4 inches to 36 feet 5 inches (within the approved footprint). As a result of this relocation, the boatlift component requires an additional Waiver of Limitation. The applicant's narrative specifies that the additional distance for these mooring structures is necessary due to the lack of water depth at this location and the avoidance of sea grass. Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required.

The Marine Advisory Board recommended approval of the application unanimously 12 to 0 (see Exhibit 3).

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
