TITLE:	Northwest Neighborhood Improvement Phase II Project – Sagaris Corp \$537,710

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the award of the Northwest Neighborhood Improvement Phase II Project to Sagaris Corp. (Sagaris) in the amount of \$537,710.

Background

The Northwest Neighborhood Improvement Phase II Project's location is at Northwest 13th Terrace, Northwest 14th Way and Northwest 14th Avenue between Sistrunk Boulevard and Northwest 7th Street. The work includes the removal of concrete and asphalt; removal of existing landscaping and wooden poles; construction of new concrete curbs, concrete sidewalks and accessible ramps; installation of sodded swales; installation of new catch basins; replacement of existing catch basin tops with manhole covers; and milling and resurfacing of existing roadways.

Invitation to Bid 253-11479 (P11485A) was opened on January 8, 2015 and seven bids were received. Sagaris is the lowest cost, responsive and responsible bidder.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$537,710 for the contract and \$91,410 in estimated engineering fees for a total of \$629,120. The available balance in the chart below reflects the amount remaining after the removal of pre-encumbrances established for this purchase.
