TITLE: Discussion regarding future of Judge Shippey House

The Judge Shippey House was moved in November 2011 from its original location on SW 7th Avenue to 220 SW 3rd Street. The plan at the time was the Friends of Shippey House would raise money to rehabilitate the structure and bring it up to code. A revocable license, effective November 15, 2011, between the City and Friends of Shippey House (FOSH) provided FOSH with the nonexclusive possession, use, construction, installation, operation and maintenance of the project improvements, attached as Exhibit 1. The revocable license terminated March 15, 2012, four (4) months after the effective date.

The property is currently vacant, fenced off and has had minimal work done to it by volunteers, pictures are attached as Exhibit 2. Staff estimates lost parking revenue to be in the amount of \$50,000 annually. Staff is requesting direction of the future of the Shippey House at its current location.

Resource Impact:

There is a negative fiscal impact to Parking Fund 461 in the amount of \$50,000 annually.
