Each applicant has complied with code violation(s) and the City's direct costs are included in the settlement recommendation. Each of these settlements is subject to the call-up provisions set forth in Resolution 13-235, and approved lien settlements must be paid no later than 45 days after the effective date of the reduction or the lien amounts revert back to the original amount.

Resource Impact
