Restroom Renovations - Walters Zackria Associates, PLLC - \$18,978.21

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order No. 2 (Exhibit 1) with Walters Zackria Associates, PLLC, in the amount of \$18,978.21, under the continuing contract for architectural services.

Background

On August 19, 2014, the City Commission approved a two-year continuing contract to Walters Zackria Associates, PLLC for architectural consulting services.

This Task Order is for design, preparation of construction and bid documents, permitting, and architectural construction administration to renovate the Fort Lauderdale Beach Park Restroom Building. Work includes updating the facility to comply with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, as well as interior and exterior improvements, including sustainable initiatives such as low-flow plumbing fixtures and light-emitting diode (LED) lights. The City will also replace exterior doors and windows, interior floor and wall finishes, stall partitions, and the plumbing fixtures with longer lasting materials appropriate for the area and use of the facility.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the in the amount of \$18,978 for the Task Order and \$1,889 for in house project management fees, for a total impact of \$20,868.
