TITLE: Motion Authorizing Purchase of Boat Engines and Installation – Pompano

Beach Marine Center, Inc. - \$87,990

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an agreement for the purchase and installation of four boat engines to Pompano Beach Marine CenterInc., in substantially the form attached, in the amount of \$87,990.

Background

The Police Marine Unit needs to replace the oldest engines in their fleet which are 2006 models that were purchased in 2008 and have been out of warranty since 2011. Boat #1 port motor has recorded 4,324 hours and its starboard motor has recorded 3,394 hours. Boat #7 port motor has recorded 4,004 hours and its starboard motor has recorded 3,990 hours. Even though these motors are 2006 models, the hours are indicative of motors that are approaching 33 to 43 years in age. This is based on the Yamaha standard that 100 hours is equal to one year's use. The combined maintenance cost for these boat motors over the last 24 months is approximately \$12,000 which does not include regularly scheduled maintenance.

The Procurement Services Division issued Invitation to Bid 452-11594 and received one bid from Pompano Beach Marine Center, Inc.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$87,990.
