## Recommendation

It is recommended that an appeal of an adverse ruling against the City in this matter be filed in the Circuit Court of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit in and for Broward County, Florida.

## **Background**

On June 7, 2013, Ms. Carey was issued a uniform traffic citation pursuant to The Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Act (Section 316.0083, Florida Statute (2013)). After conducting an evidentiary hearing, on May 12, 2015, County Court Judge Steven Deluca, citing to *City of Hollywood v. Arem*, 154 So.3d 359 (Fla. 4<sup>th</sup> DCA, 2014), entered an order dismissing Ms. Carey's case finding that the City of Fort Lauderdale improperly delegated its police power of reviewing and issuing red light camera violations to its third party vendor, American Traffic Solutions, Inc. Additionally, the Court indicated that it intends to amend the Carey Dismissal Order to include the dismissal of an additional 367 pending Fort Lauderdale red light camera prosecutions.

Based upon the evidence presented to the Court, the City Attorney's Office believes that the City has a good faith basis to seek appellate review of Judge Deluca's Order. Furthermore, the Court's decision has a substantial impact upon the operation and effectiveness of the City's automated red light camera traffic system.
