TITLE: Motion to Approve Neutral-Host Distributed Antenna System - Miller

Electric Company and MPBX, LLC – \$92,479.32

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a three-year contract for the purchase of a neutral-host distributed antenna system (DAS) and associated professional services with Miller Electric Company and MPBX, LLC., in substantially the form attached, at a cost of \$92,479.32; and authorize the City Manager to approve additional one-year renewal options, contingent upon appropriation of funds.

### **Background**

The Greg Brewton Sustainable Development Center is a category five building constructed of concrete walls, metal decking roof and impact resistant windows. As this structure can withstand major hurricanes, it can also prevent the propagation of cell phone signals. Currently, cell phone connectivity is limited to very weak signals in areas near windows.

In 2008, Sprint installed a bidirectional antenna system (BDA) to provide in-building wireless connectivity (for Sprint customers only). The current system is outdated and needs to be replaced with an updated design that supports all major cell phone carriers and new technologies.

The background for the solicitation process included the following:

- December 2014 Request for Proposal (RFP) 855-11520 was issued for neutral-host distributed antenna system and professional services.
- February 2015 The RFP closed with a total of five firms submitting proposals including:

Bluestream Professional Services

McNeal Professional Services
Miller Electric Company (in partnership with MPBX, LLC)
Proximity Wireless.
Zinwaye

 March 2015 – The evaluation committee consisting of Gary Gray, Assistant Telecommunications Manager; Alex Hernandez, Assistant Building Official; Fernando Ayrosa, Sr. Technology Strategist; and Nelson Martinez, Sr. Technology Strategist met with Barry Sageman, Procurement Specialist I, to evaluate the proposals and rank the firms according to the evaluation criteria. The evaluation committee shortlisted the three top ranked firms for oral presentations. The shortlisted firms were:

Bluestream Professional Services.

McNeal Professional Services

Miller Electric Company (in partnership with MPBX, LLC)

 May 2015 – After oral presentations, the evaluation committee then rescored the proposals and ranked the firms. Including all evaluation criteria, the final tabulation ranked Miller Electric Company (in partnership with MPBX, LLC) number one as shown in the table below.
