TITLE: Resolution Approving the Fiscal Year 2016 Central Wastewater Region
Large User Rate of \$1.80 per 1,000 Gallons of Wastewater Treated

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution setting the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 Central Region Wastewater large user rate at \$1.80 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated, effective October 1, 2015.

Background

The City, through Large User Agreements, operates the Central Wastewater Region facilities, including the George T. Lohmeyer Wastewater Treatment Facility (GTL). The Central Wastewater Region provides treatment services for five cities including Fort Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Wilton Manors, Tamarac, and parts of Davie. Fort Lauderdale accounts for approximately 80 percent of the wastewater treatment services provided by the Central Region.

The Large User Agreements, necessitated by federal funding requirements, establish a methodology for setting rates for large users. The City Commission sets a billing rate based upon budgeted expenditures and assumed gallons of wastewater to be treated for the upcoming fiscal year. At the close of the year, the fund is audited and the actual rate is determined. Lump sum charges or rebates are made to adjust the amount paid by each user based upon the actual rate.

The Central Wastewater Region Large User Advisory Board, at its August 12, 2015 meeting, recommended a rate of \$1.80 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated. The Central Wastewater Region Operating Budget for FY 2016 is \$26,531,158.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact for FY 2015.
