TITLE:	Administrative Fee for Large Scale Events

The City of Fort Lauderdale strives to celebrate our community through special events. Annually, over 200 events are approved through our special events process and hosted in our City. While an asset to the quality of life in our community, planning for such events can be challenging at times, as well as obtaining all necessary documentation (insurance, transportation plans, site plans, permits, escrow, and executed agreements) in a timely manner.

Over the past few years, the City has partnered with event organizers to host large scale events such as the Tortuga Music Festival, Red Bull Global Rallycross, and most recently the SWACTH Volleyball tournament. Although these events are very popular and offer a positive economic impact for the City, the administrative tasks associated with these large scale events are time consuming for staff.

Parks and Recreation is proposing a 10% administrative fee, 10% of estimated/actual, (whichever is less) of City costs, on large scale events (events with more than an anticipated 5,000 patrons or those events that extend over a period of time) to recover cost associated with the coordination of these events.

Should the Commission be in favor of the idea, the item will be placed on a regular agenda for Commission action.

Resource Impact

There will be a positive fiscal impact to the City.
