Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC) Recommendations to the Affordable Housing Policy

(1) Utilize the Affordable Housing Terminology that the City has previously adopted by the Commission and exists within current funding programs and guidelines.

Article 1: Affordable means that monthly housing costs do not exceed 30% of monthly income, however, it is not the intent to limit an individual household's ability to devote more than 30% of its income for housing, particular if a program allows for it.

(2) Establish an Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Article 2: The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Ordinance should be developed with recommendations from the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee and adopted before the end of fiscal year 2016.

(3) Create a locally generated and dedicated source of funding for affordable housing.

Article 2: The Affordable Housing Trust Fund should be funded by (1) 100% of the net proceeds from the sale of <u>all</u> residential lots; (2) 15% of the net proceeds from the sale of commercial and industrial lots; and (3) existing funds in the account (approximately \$300,000).

(4) Provide affordable housing for income eligible households.

Article 3 and 4: Any residential properties which are donated, discounted from the City shall be used to provide affordable housing for households earning less than 140% of the median income and shall remain affordable for a minimum of 15 years.

(5) Establish selection criteria for affordable housing developers/developments.

The City should partner with experienced affordable housing developers. Priority should be given to projects that reserve housing for low and very low income households, and developments that create a permanent source of affordable housing.

(6) Locate affordable housing near transit.

The City should include affordable housing as a critical part of any new transit oriented developments and adjacent to rail, bus and trolley lines.

(7) Update City of Fort Lauderdale's housing ordinance(s).

The City should adopt corresponding ordinances to implement the programs discussed in the affordable housing plan before the end of fiscal year 2016.
