TITLE: Resolution in Support of an Additional 1% (1-cent) for Tourist

Development Tax Earmarked for Marketing, Beach Renourishment, and

Convention Center Expansion

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, approve a resolution in support of an additional 1%(1-cent) Tourist Development Tax (TDT) and setting priorities as marketing of the Greater Fort Lauderdale area, beach renourishment, and Convention Center expansion.

# **Background**

The Tourist Development Tax in Broward County is currently levied at 5% or 5 cents on each dollar spent in Broward County for short term accommodations such as hotels, time shares, or homes rented for six months or less. The revenue from the Tourist Development Tax is collected by Broward County and allocated for several important competing demands including beach renourishment, convention center expansion and operations, marketing of the greater Fort Lauderdale area, cultural arts support, and support for the County-owned arena. Since approximately 50% of the TDT is generated and collected from properties within the City of Fort Lauderdale, it is critical that the funds generated are to support the high quality and service demands associated with heightened tourism activities within the City of Fort Lauderdale.

The Tourist Development Council has expressed an interest in levying an additional 1% Tourist Development Tax for Broward County which is the final penny allowable under the state statutes. The City supports this additional levy, but is requesting that the funds be prioritized for use as follows:

- Marketing of the Greater Fort Lauderdale Area
- Beach Renourishment
- Convention Center Expansion

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### **Resource Impact**

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
