TITLE: Multi-Focused Community Policing Assessment Status Presentation

Bobcat Training & Consulting, Inc. was contracted to evaluate the Police Department's performance in community policing, community outreach, recruiting, hiring, training and complaint management. Five consultants participated in the assessment, which consisted of "one on one" personnel interviews, neighbor interviews, focus group discussions, command staff interviews as well as attending the Council of Civic Association meetings and Citizens Police Review Board. The evaluation occurred over a 7-day period. With regard to the neighbor interviews, the consultants met with a number of neighbors in person and conducted several phone interviews to collect feedback on the Department's performance.

The effort resulted in a final report titled the "Multi-Focused Community Policing Assessment" that was delivered in July of 2015. Included in the report were 43 recommendations addressing each of the mentioned police function areas. The report was evaluated by command staff and responses prepared for each recommendation. The below table summarizes the quantity of recommendations in each status.
