**TITLE**: Police Body Worn Cameras Pilot Program

Bobcat Training and Consulting, Inc. recommends all sworn personnel should be issued body cameras and required to record all citizen encounters. In addition, the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF) and several cities across America conducted independent studies that indicate body worn cameras have the potential to improve officer safety, officer professionalism, evidence preservation and transparency while also reducing frivolous misconduct complaints and lawsuits (please see attached). Body worn cameras are capable of recording video and audio while worn by officers in the field, which allows unprecedented documentation of police and civilian encounters. This heightened level of police surveillance has inherent privacy and Freedom of Information Act issues that have not been fully addressed by current Florida legislation. We are seeking direction from the City Commission prior to advancing a pilot program.
