**TITLE:** Motion Authorizing Professional Services for Aquatic Center Evaluation -  
Walters Zackria Associates - \$78,209.47

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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order No. 6 from Walters Zackria Associates (WZA) to conduct a comprehensive evaluation and provide a cost estimate for the rehabilitation of the Fort Lauderdale Aquatics Complex in an amount not to exceed \$78,209.47.

**Background**

On December 1, 2015 the City Commission terminated the Developer's Agreement with Recreational Design and Construction, Inc. (RDC), and instructed staff to investigate the cost to rehabilitate the existing facility with available Community Redevelopment Agency funding. Staff is proposing to utilize an existing architectural continuing services agreement with WZA to inspect the existing facility and provide cost estimates for rehabilitation. The information will be compiled into a report and provided to Commission for the April 5, 2016 Conference Agenda.

The scope of services in the task order will include the following:

- Analyze and document existing site conditions.
- Review existing available drawings, reports and etc.
- Perform an architectural analysis of existing facilities, including buildings and bleachers.
- Perform a Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing (MEP) analysis of all mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems.
- Perform a structural engineering analysis of seawall.
- Perform an aquatic engineering analysis of the pools and pool equipment.
- Prepare an assessment report explaining analyses and provide recommendations.
- Prepare a statement of probable costs.

In accordance with the Master Agreement Clause 11.7.2, WZA has added specialty sub-consultants (Exhibit 1) to their team to perform the work as described above. Aquadynamics Design Group, Inc. was added to inspect the pools and Bromley-Cook

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Engineering, Inc. was added to inspect the seawalls.

A detailed description of the scope of services and deliverables is provided in Task Order No. 6 (Exhibit 2).

### **Resource Impact**

There will be a fiscal impact to the CRA in the amount of \$78,209.47. Funding for this item is contingent upon the Community Redevelopment Board of Directors approval of CAM 16-0152.
