TITLE: Motion to Approve Donation to Onikusu Judo Club - \$30,000 from State

Law Enforcement Trust Fund

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a donation to the Onikusu Judo Club in the amount of \$30,000 utilizing State Law Enforcement Trust Fund.

Background

On September 4, 2005, the Fort Lauderdale Branch of the NAACP formed a partnership with the City of Fort Lauderdale Parks and Recreation Department, the Broward State Attorney's Office Alternative Sentencing Adolescent Program for first time offenders and retired Fort Lauderdale Police Detective Ghalib Carmichael. Through their partnership, the Onikusu Judo Club was established. The program began with kids between the ages of 5 and 18.

A minimum of 100 kids enter the Onikusu Judo Club Program annual, and its recidivism rate is 2%. Trust Fund proceeds will be used exclusively to offset the expenses incurred for diversionary offenders' participation in club activities. Any non-diversionary participants will not receive trust fund monies to offset their participation costs.

The major goals of the program are as follows:

- To prevent juvenile crime and violence
- Create trust between police officers and youth
- Develop strong and positive attitudes towards police officers through civic, athletic, recreational and educational opportunities and resources
- Work to reduce juvenile delinquency
- Increase the participant's opportunity for physical activity and individual success
- Build self-esteem while teaching kids how to make decisions on their own
- Identify positive alternatives to drugs and violence
- To be a diversion to kids who may have committed non-violent offenses

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$30,000.
