# **CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE CONSOLIDATED PLAN PROPOSED HOPWA PROGRAM AMENDMENT (30 Day Public Comment Period)**

The City of Fort Lauderdale is considering amending its 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 Annual Action Plans of the 2010-2015 Consolidated Plan for the Housing Opportunities for Persons with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA) program. In accordance with the Substantial Change Policy of the City's HUD approved Consolidated Plan, any change in HOPWA assisted activity as a result of the addition or cancellation of a program or a change in the purpose, scope, location or beneficiary of an activity, requires a program amendment to the Annual Action Plan of the Consolidated Plan. The City of Fort Lauderdale's program amendment and substantial change policy requires Commission Approval and public input at a public hearing after proper notice has been published for a 30-day public comment period. We propose to amend the Fiscal Years 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 HOPWA funds as follows:

The proposed amendments as requested by the Fort Lauderdale City Commission would reallocate funding to Broward House, Broward Regional Health Planning Council (BRHPC), Mount Olive Development Corp (MODCO), and SunServe.

The request for moving funds to Broward House and MODCO is for the renovation of currently owned HOPWA housing units. SunServe will use the HOPWA funds to offer individualized financial management classes that are designed to assist low income clients to maintain, strengthen and prevent homelessness. BRHPC will provide assistance to HOPWA clients to maintain housing stability by helping them navigate the affordable health care act.

These are federal funds and have no impact on the general fund budget. This amendment is in accordance with HUD regulations and will allow the projects to proceed to completion.

In accordance with federal regulations, the City is hereby establishing a 30-day public comment period to receive input on the proposed amendment to its Annual Action Plans of the Consolidated Plan. Comments on the proposed change(s) may be submitted to the City of Fort Lauderdale, Housing & Community Development Division, 700 NW 19th Ave., Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33311. Public comments on these items will be accepted during the 30-day public comment period from November 14, 2014 to December 15, 2014. All comments must be received by December 15, 2014. The City will evaluate all comments received during the comment period, and the final amendment will be submitted to the Commission at a public hearing on December 17, 2014. Public input will also be accepted at this public hearing on this amendment. A copy of the final amendment will be available for public review at the Community Development Division at the above address during regular office hours. At the close of the public hearing, the City Commission will consider a motion approving the program amendment to the Annual Action Plans of the Consolidated Plans.
