TITLE: Motion to Approve Additional Expenditures for Industrial Painting Services
– J & J, Inc. d/b/a Eagle Painting - \$60,000

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an amendment to agreement for industrial painting services from J & J, Inc. d/b/a Eagle Painting for additional expenditures in the amount of \$60,000; and authorize the City Manager to approve three one-year renewal options.

Background

On November 3, 2015 the City Commission approved the award of Contract 453-11613 for industrial painting services to J & J, Inc. d/b/a Eagle Painting in the amount of \$93,000 for a two-year term (CAM 15-1148) for the Public Works Department.

The Parks and Recreation Department also has a need for these services. Per a Comprehensive Facility Condition Assessment, additional external painting projects were established for various City facilities. The following locations are scheduled for exterior painting: Jimmy Evert Tennis Center, George English Tennis Center, Morton Activity Center, Fire Station #13 and the Henry E. Kinney Tunnel. Other small interior projects will also be completed.

A Change Order in the amount \$16,200 was administratively approved, increasing the contract value to \$109,200. Should the additional \$60,000 be approved, the total cumulative contract value will be \$169,200.

Resource Impact

There will be a current fiscal year impact to the City in the amount of \$60,000.
