TITLE: Motion to Approve the Creation of a Citizen Police Review Board Sub-

Committee

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the creation of a Citizen Police Review Board (CPRB) sub-committee.

Background

The CPRB desires to broaden the scope and authority of the CPRB's review of internal police investigations. On February 8, 2016, the CPRB unanimously voted to create a sub-committee for the purpose of exploring and proposing potential revisions to Sections 248-250 of the City of Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinances. The sub-committee will make recommendations to the CPRB, and the CPRB will vote on the proposed revisions with the intent of bringing said revisions to the City Commission for consideration. The CPRB Liaison Officer will attend all sub-committee meetings, which will incur overtime costs. In addition, there will be costs associated with transcriptions of the meetings in the amount of \$115.00 per hour and recordings of the meetings at a cost of \$95.00 per meeting, which is funded by the City Clerk's Office.

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$9,947.00 for FY 2016.
