TITLE Motion to Approve an Agreement with Cellebrite, Inc. –120-Day Test and

Evaluation of UFED Infield Kiosks

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an agreement with Cellebrite, Inc. to test and evaluate two UFED Infield Kiosks for a period of 120 days.

Background

Cellebrite's cell phone examination product, the UFED Infield Kiosk, facilitates the identification of over 14,000 devices and the recovery of evidence and information utilizing multiple processes. The Kiosk can be deployed in remote locations and provide forensically sound extractions of evidence and information. Evidentiary integrity is ensured by way of the Kiosk's UFED Permission Manager component. During the testing of the product, the Fort Lauderdale Police Department (FLPD) will receive two Kiosk devices. One device will be tested by the FLPD and the other by the US Secret Service (USSS), a Task Force partner with the City in the investigation of electronic crime and where a Fort Lauderdale investigator is assigned. This broad testing of the Kiosk will provide significant opportunity to evaluate the claim that the device is capable of recovering evidence quickly and effectively.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

Strategic Connections

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018* initiative, included within the Public Safety Cylinders of Excellence, specifically advancing:
