TITLE: Motion to Authorize the City Manager to Execute a Letter of No Objection

to the Establishment of an ERUV in the City of Fort Lauderdale

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the City Manager to execute a letter of no objection to the establishment of an ERUV within the municipal jurisdiction of the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Background

In late 2015, the Downtown Jewish Center Chabad approached the City seeking permission to construct and maintain an ERUV in the City of Fort Lauderdale. An ERUV is defined as a line delineating an area that symbolically extends the private domain of Jewish households into public areas, permitting activities within that area normally forbidden in public on the Sabbath. The proposed boundaries are I-595 to the south, Oakland Park Boulevard to the north, I-95 to the west and the Atlantic Ocean to the east.

The Downtown Jewish Center Chabad requests that the City Manager issue a letter granting the Center the right to establish an ERUV in the City of Fort Lauderdale. A letter was drafted stating that the City of Fort Lauderdale has no objection to the installation and maintenance of an ERUV so long as the ERUV does not violate federal and state law, City charter and local ordinances. ERUVs in South Florida can be found in Hollywood, Hallandale Beach, and Miami Beach to name a few.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the city associated with this item.
