Results Related to Infrastructure

The City of Fort Lauderdale has received significant public input regarding infrastructure needs and services over the past three years through Neighbor Surveys. In the most recent Neighbor Survey, the issues below were rated as either a "high" or "very high" priorities to City of Fort Lauderdale neighbors:

- Overall flow of traffic,
- Maintenance of streets/sidewalks/infrastructure,
- Safety of biking, and
- Management of traffic flow and congestion,

Neighbors' satisfaction with priorities and/or services related to infrastructure and athletic fields within the City is enumerated in the table below. The scores provided indicate the percentage of respondents who indicated they were "satisfied" with the given indicator.
