TITLE: Resolution Approving an Extension of a Temporary Moratorium on the

Installation of Communications Facilities and Distributed Antenna Systems

within the Public Rights-of-Way through December 6, 2016

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission extend the ordinance imposing a temporary moratorium on the installation of communications facilities and distributed antenna systems within the City of Fort Lauderdale's Public Rights-of-Way through December 6, 2016 or until adoption of the ordinance regulating the subject matter of the Moratorium Ordinance, whichever shall first occur.

Background

On September 3, 2014 Ordinance C-14-34 was adopted by the City Commission which imposed a 180-day temporary moratorium regarding the installation of communications facilities and Distributed Antenna Systems ("DAS") within the City's Public Rights-of-Way retroactive to the effective date of August 19, 2014. On February 3, 2015, the City Commission extended the moratorium to May 16, 2015. On May 5, 2015, the City Commission extended the moratorium to August 8, 2015. On July 7, 2015, the City Commission extended the moratorium to November 6, 2015. On November 3, 2015, the City Commission extended the moratorium to February 16, 2016. On February 16, 2016, the City Commission extended the moratorium to April 19, 2016. On April 19, 2016, the City Commission extended the moratorium to June 21, 2016. On June 7, 2016, the City Commission extended the moratorium to September 7, 2016.

There is need for additional time to analyze and consider the comments from industry representatives and make appropriate adjustments to the Communications Facilities in Public Rights-Of-Way Ordinance which was adopted by the City Commission on first reading on February 2, 2016.

Resource Impact:

There is no fiscal impact to the City.
