- **TITLE**: Resolution Authorizing the Acceptance of Additional Grant Funds and Execution of a Supplemental Joint Participation Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation for Runway 9/27 and 13/31 Pavement Rehabilitation at Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission accept an additional \$170,784 in grant funding from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for up to 80% of the project costs, for Runway 9/27 and 13/31 Pavement Rehabilitation and approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Supplemental Joint Participation Agreement (SJPA) on behalf of the City.

Background

Under a statewide plan, FDOT conducted an inspection of the runway pavements and developed a plan identifying the runway pavement condition. The Pavement Condition Index (PCI) number from the Pavement Management Plan rated runway 9/27 and 13/31 as 85 out of 100 based on the Airport's Pavement Management Program report. The report recommends that a rejuvenator sealant be applied to both runways to suspend the aging process, which will extend the pavement life and maintain the PCI rating.

On March 3, 2015, the City Commission approved a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) with FDOT in the amount of \$432,000 for approximately 80% of the eligible costs to complete the above work. Plans and specifications were prepared and the project was advertised in March 2016. Two bids were opened in April with the low bidder amount being in excess of the project budget. Airport staff discussed the option of obtaining additional grant funding from FDOT in the form of a SJPA. FDOT has provided an SJPA in the amount of \$170,784 for the additional project costs. The grant match amount of \$42,696 is provided in the Airport's fund balance account. Additionally, \$55,446 is needed for project management fees.

This item was reviewed by the Aviation Advisory Board at its August 25, 2016 meeting and the Board recommended that the City approve the acceptance of these grant funds.

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$170,784 for the grant revenue and a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$42,696 for the required grant match and \$55,446 for project management fees, contingent upon approval and appropriation of the September 7, 2016 Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM #16-1028.
