**TITLE**: Resolution Amending the Speed Hump Policy to Change the Eligibility

Requirements

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the current speed hump policy to change the eligibility requirements and to remove conflicting language.

### **Background**

The City's current speed hump policy utilizes the following criteria for consideration of speed hump installation on neighborhood streets: 1) traffic volume & speed data, 2) roadway classification, geometrics, and design features, and 3) neighborhood support. There is also a factor that can be applied if there is a school or park along the roadway that relaxes the speed and volume thresholds.

After performing research of other City speed hump policies and programs, staff recommends the following changes:

- Reduce the average speed requirement by 2 MPH.
- Reduce the minimum average vehicle volume by 50 (from 500 to 450).
- Add an additional eligibility factor recommendations made as part of a comprehensive planning process that considers impacts to the roadway network, such as a neighborhood mobility master plan, may be considered in lieu of meeting the speed and volume thresholds.
- Remove conflicting language regarding the type of speed humps relative to the vehicle volume threshold.

If eligible, the current process requires that a majority of support (60%) be demonstrated and documented through a survey process. No change is recommended for this condition.

## **Resource Impact**
