STATUS REPORT

- Canal Assessment and Dredging Master Plan
 - ✓ City Commission approved funding for remaining surveys (January 2016)
 - ✓ Completed 100% Citywide Surveys (August 12th)
 - Process survey data and determine dredging needs of remaining canals (October 30th 2016)
 - Finalize Canal Dredging Master Plan (November 30th)
- Rate Study and Funding Mechanism
 - ✓ Issued Canal Dredging Rate Study solicitation (August 18th)
 - Review RFPs and select financial consultant (September 30th)
 - Award financial consultant contract (November 15th)
 - Complete rate study and present to Budget Advisory Board and City Commission (June 2017)



COMPREHENSIVE CANAL ASSESSMENT

Remaining Canals Surveyed for Analysis:

8 miles (navigable)

- + 6 miles (drainage)
- = 14 miles (of recently surveyed canals)
- 40% (5.6 miles) will need dredging
- Design & permit: \$0.50 M
- Const. Cost: \$2.24 M \$2.74 M


Known dredging needs:

10 miles (navigable)

Design & Permit: \$1.01 M

Const. Cost: \$3.73 M

\$4.74 M



Total cost of master plan (forecast of unknown + known dredge needs) = \$2.74 M + \$4.74 = \$7.5 M (Rounded)





RATE STUDY TIMELINE

RFP

- RFP Advertised to obtain financial consultant 8/18/16
- City approves consultant contract award 11/15/16

Rate Study

- Consultant to conduct rate study 11/17/16 4/28/17
- Rate study review by City staff 5/1/17 5/31/17

Approve

- Submit recommended rate structure to Budget Advisory Board June 2017
- Present to City Commission Conference Meeting for consideration
- Minimum of 2 Public Hearings at City Commission Regular Meetings
- Adopt intent resolution & submit copy of intent to County by January 1 2018

NEIGHBOR CONCERNS


- Neighbor Concerns:

- City vs. non-City canals
- Prioritization of dredging within Master Plan
- Environmental permitting requirements
- Process to request dredging and timeline to complete work
- Drainage vs. Navigable canal standards

- Shallow finger canals
- Canal end treatments
- Restricted areas
- Potential damage to private seawalls

2011 Marine Advisory Board accepted Canal Dredging criteria







NEXT STEPS

- Award contract for consultant to conduct a rate study (November 2016)
- Commission provide direction on funding mechanism to allow dedicated funding stream in FY2019
- Budget for specific survey, design, and environmental permitting in FY2018
- Budget for construction/dredging based on revenues available in FY 2019
