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The Hyundai continued east and drove through a stop sign, colliding with two vehicles: One held a mother and child, the other was driven by a man, Cabrera said.

The three people in the Hyundai ran and two were caught, Cabrera said.

"They're juveniles, and they're not talking," Cabrera said. A ground search by police, aided by a Broward Sheriff's helicopter, did not find the third person whose age is not yet known.

"We think he called a friend to pick him up, because we saw another car in the area," Cabrera said.

Three people had minor injuries after the crash, and all were taken to Northwest Regional Hospital in Margate.

Police drove one of the juveniles to the hospital and Pompano Beach Fire Rescue took the other boy as well as the woman who was in one of the cars that collided with the Hyundai.

So now the case will go before a grand jury in Stafford Circuit Court on Jan. 3, said Nicole B. McGuire, clerk of the district court. It will be up to the grand jury, which meets privately, to decide whether to indict Love-Robinson.

If indicted, Love-Robinson would likely face an arraignment hearing in early February where he can plead not guilty, Marzloff told the Sun Sentinel.

While there is an active Palm Beach County warrant for Love-Robinson's arrest, he will remain in Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond until the case is resolved there.

Virginia officials say Love-Robinson used his godmother's name on a car loan application without permission, used her Social Security number and used her credit card without her knowledge to

buy iPads and a cellphone for \$1,200. Love-Robinson told deputies he was in town to buy a car for himself and his godmother, according to a news release.

He was charged with: attempt to commit identity theft; attempt to obtain money under false pretenses; and attempt to make a false statement to obtain credit. These counts are punishable by up to 25 years in prison.

Meanwhile, Palm Beach County Circuit Judge Krista Marx has scheduled a Dec. 14 case status hearing concerning the 14 local charges.

Love-Robinson has pleaded not guilty to: two counts of practicing medicine without a license; two counts of practice of naturopathy without a license; three counts of forgery; two counts of grand theft from a person 65 or older; three counts of fraudulent use of personal identification information; one count of grand theft over \$20,000; and one count of obtaining property in return for a worthless check, draft or debit card.

All of these charges are punishable by a total of up to 90 years in state prison. At one point this year he rejected a plea offer calling for three years in prison and five years probation.

Love-Robinson's former lawyer had informed Judge Marx about the possibility of an insanity defense; Love-Robinson had been undergoing mental health treatments.

In media interviews this year, he denied any wrongdoing, calling himself a doctor of homeopathic medicine and a health care practitioner specializing in all-natural treatments.

But authorities say Love-Robinson used fraudulent diplomas and wore a white lab coat and stethoscope while presenting himself as a licensed physician.

Prosecutors say Love-Robinson made \$34,504 in payments — for his credit cards and Nissan car loans — from the checking account of an 86-year-old West Palm Beach woman he was seeing about her severe intestinal pain.
