TITLE: Motion to Approve Contracts for Wastewater Conveyance System Long-

Term Rehabilitation – Pre-Qualified Pool of Contractors – \$15,000,000

(two year total)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve two-year contracts, in substantially the forms attached, for wastewater conveyance system long-term rehabilitation services with the top five ranked contractors: Miller Pipeline, LLC; Insituform Technologies, LLC; LMK Pipe Renewal, LLC; Lanzo Trenchless Technologies, Inc. – South; and Layne Inliner, LLC in the not-to-exceed amount of \$15,000,000 for the two-year term, and authorize the City Manager to approve three one-year renewal options contingent upon appropriation of funds. The total amount is for the initial two-year term and is to be distributed among the contractors.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale solicited prequalified contractors to provide long-term wastewater rehabilitation services for projects throughout the City. The selected general contractors will provide labor, equipment, and materials for rehabilitation of wastewater systems, as authorized by task orders for individual projects. It is the intent of the City to use the selected contractors on an as-needed basis. All prequalified contractors will participate in a sealed bid process for specific projects. Pursuant to Section 2-127 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, task orders will be awarded based on the lowest cost and most responsive bid for each project. The selected contractors will provide the services required of any project task order through the use of their own staff and/or sub-contractors.

The scope of work will be based on capital improvement projects and includes but is not limited to mainline sewer lining, repair, or replacement; lateral service connections; manhole rehabilitation; point repairs; and other services deemed necessary by the City to ensure that rehabilitation of the wastewater systems are completed in accordance with plans and specifications provided for each task order and is proceeding in accordance with all applicable codes and laws. The contract sum is an estimate and not a guarantee of the amount of work that will be assigned.

The timeline of the solicitation process included the following:

- August 12, 2016 Request for Qualifications (RFQ) 466-11799 was issued for wastewater conveyance system long-term rehabilitation.
- September 27, 2016 The RFQ closed with a total of nine firms submitting proposals including:

 October 21, 2016 – The Evaluation Committee (Committee), consisting of Katherine Griffith, Project Manager II; Luis Oliveira, Project Manager I; and Rick Johnson, Distribution and Collections Manager, met with Althea Pemsel, Senior Procurement Specialist, to evaluate the proposals. The firms were ranked based on the evaluation criteria shown in the table below.
