- **TITLE:** Resolution Waiving Division 2, Purchasing, of Chapter 2, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida to Approve Contract and Business Associate Agreement for Employee Health Center Professional Medical Services Marathon Health, LLC \$3,409,549 (three-year total)

### **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution waiving Division 2, Purchasing, of Chapter 2, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida to approve a three-year contract and Business Associate Agreement, in substantially the forms attached, with Marathon Health, LLC (Marathon) in the estimated amount of \$3,409,549 for employee health center professional medical and other services; and authorize the City Manager or designee, to approve three one-year renewal options, contingent upon appropriation of funds, and to exercise additional staffing options, if and when necessary.

### **Background**

Marathon's predecessor by conversion under Delaware law, Marathon Health, Inc., began providing professional medical services at the City's health center on May 22, 2013 under a contract that will expire April 3, 2017. Marathon Health, Inc. was selected as the result of an extensive Request for Proposal process that scrutinized nine different proposals. Marathon provides accessible primary, preventative, acute care, wellness, disease management, health coaching, and a limited generic formulary, among other services to City employees and family members enrolled in any of the City's health plans.

The employee and dependent utilization rate of the health center has grown dramatically since its inception. As of November 2016, 63% of employees and 28% of dependents regularly utilize the health center for primary care services. In addition, 64% of high-risk employees and 46% of high-risk dependents are engaged with the medical staff to remediate identified health risks. Employees and dependents rate the health center very favorably, with three consecutive years at 98% overall satisfaction. Current information shows that 62% of the target populations with risk factors or chronic conditions have made measureable clinical improvements.

The proposal for services offered by Marathon provides for a three-year contract term and three one-year renewal options. Marathon proposes no increase in fees for the first year and a two percent increase for each of the following five years. In addition, Marathon has provided pricing for additional staffing at the health center due to a recent increase in demand for services. The additional staffing includes a part-time nurse practitioner, a part-time medical assistant, and a part-time dietician. The pricing for these positions is included in the overall fee noted above. Details of the expenses are included in Exhibit 3.

## Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$588,836 for fiscal year 2017.
