Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the addition of funds to the existing Architectural Consulting Services Contracts #936-11270 with ACAI Associates, Inc., Walters Zackria Associates, PLLC, and Synalovski Romanik Saye, LLC in the aggregate amount of \$337,538.

Background

On August 19, 2014, the City Commission approved a two-year contract with two one-year renewal options for architectural consulting services with the consultants noted above (CAM 14-0896). The Commission subsequently approved a first renewal on June 7, 2016 (CAM 16-0626).

Subsequently, new projects have been identified that require the utilization of these services, including the 40-Year Building Inspections (Project 12277) and the Parking Administration Building Structural Repairs (Project 11660). Funding for these services will be from the individual projects when services are contracted through individual task orders.
