TITLE: Motion Approving the Acceptance of Equipment from the Broward County
Healthcare Coalition - \$9,490

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion authorizing the Mayor and City Manager to accept equipment from the Broward County Healthcare Coalition.

Background

The Broward County Healthcare Coalition received grant funds to purchase new equipment from ByoPlanet International used to dispense EPA approved disinfectants designed to disinfect the patient compartment of medical rescue units. The Coalition is donating this equipment to the City of Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue.

ByoPlanet International uses an induction charged mechanical delivery system to provide 100% coverage to any surface without the threat of cross contamination. Their patented "Powder Coating" technology charges the liquid – driving it to the surface – literally wrapping around every touch point and is safe to use around sensitive equipment. The entire process lasts approximately three minutes.

The City of Fort Lauderdale will accept the following items:
One ByoPlanet CS-900 for \$4,995.00 and one ByoPlanet BP-500 for \$4,495.00. The total cost for the equipment is \$9,490.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City.

Strategic Connections

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018* initiative, included within the Public Safety Cylinders of Excellence, specifically advancing:

- Goal 9: Be the safest urban coastal City in South Florida through preventative and responsive police and fire protection.
